Christina Snyder is the Thomas Milton Miller and Kathryn Owens Miller Associate Professor of History at Indiana University, Bloomington. Her first book, *Slavery in Indian Country: The Changing Face of Captivity in Early America* (Harvard, 2010) won several awards, including the Berkshire Conference of Women Historians' First Book Prize, the James H. Broussard Prize from the Society of Historians of the Early American Republic, and the John C. Ewers Prize from the Western History Association. Snyder's forthcoming book, *Great Crossings*, will be released by Oxford University Press in early 2017.
